Auburn Wastewater Plant Recognized for Excellence

AUBURN, Alabama (July 1, 2019) -- The H.C. Morgan Water Pollution Control Facility, which provides wastewater treatment services for the City of Auburn, has been awarded the Plant Excellence Award from Alabama's Water Environment Association (AWEA) for 2018. The award signifies the facility has met the highest standards among all wastewater facilities across the state with a treatment capacity of more than 10 million gallons per day. This is the second consecutive year the plant, operated and maintained by Veolia North America, has received the award.
